#### Notice Concerning Judgment Rendered in Singapore Against Our Singapore Subsidiary

Nippon Chemi-Con Corporation (the “Company”) hereby makes an announcement further to the Company’s “Notice Concerning Filing of Lawsuit in Singapore Against Our Singapore Subsidiary” dated December 9, 2024. SINGAPORE CHEMI-CON (PTE) LTD. (“SCC”), a subsidiary of the Company, was sued by Dyson Manufacturing Sdn. Bhd. (the “Claimant”) before the Singapore International Commercial Court on November 29, 2024 (local time), and received the Originating Application and the Claimant’s Statement. SCC thereafter proceeded with the court proceedings. We hereby announce that, on September 18, 2026 (local time), the court rendered a judgment ordering SCC to make payment.

#### 1. From the Filing of the Lawsuit to the Judgment

The Claimant filed a lawsuit and alleged against SCC that the defect rate had increased in certain products of the Claimant’s group manufactured from June 2022 onward and that the cause of such increase lay in components purchased from SCC, among other allegations, and sought payment of damages. The Singapore International Commercial Court accepted certain arguments made by SCC, but rendered a judgment ordering SCC to pay a portion of the damages claimed by the Claimant.

#### 2. SCC’s Liability

As a result of the judgment, SCC has incurred liability in the amount of GBP 92,726,123 (approximately JPY 19.37 billion). In addition to this amount, the amount to be borne by SCC out of GBP 3,131,760 (approximately JPY 650 million), which is part of the amount claimed by the Claimant, the amount of the Claimant’s legal fees and other costs to be borne by SCC, and whether pre-judgment interest is payable and, if so, the amount thereof, will be determined going forward. With respect to this lawsuit, SCC will consider filing an appeal and will handle future processes appropriately.

#### 3. Impact on Financial Results

The extraordinary loss based on the judgment and the impact of the judgment on the Company’s financial results are currently under review, and the Company will promptly disclose information once the outlook becomes clear.
